### Omiya Bonsai Museum, Saitama city

- After the effect of Great Kanto Earthquake in 1923 many gardeners who worked for Edo feudal loads and samurai, moved from Tokyo to Omiya city and established community for gardening as Bonsai village.
- Display of Bonsai inside of the building and its garden
- Bonsai is not only a tree in a pot, but it shows overall landscape.


### Omiya Bonsai Museum



- -Located in Bonsai village in Saitama city, 30km north from Tokyo
- -Accessibilityflat entrance, elevator,toilet
  - No Braille information
- -Can enjoy walking in Bonsai village where there are some Bonsai farms. Ohmiya park nearby is famous as one of the sakura (cherry blossom) spots.

# Railway Museum

- Established for commemorating the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary(2007) of the JR East Japan after privatized from the National Railways.
- It preserves physical elements and heritage of railways of Japan and abroad.
- Attracts many fans of railways inside and outside of Japan
- Accessibility: Toilet (universal and special toilet for ostomates, and service dogs), slope, no braille

Ryogoku: Kokugi kan (Sumo wrestling stadium)

Edo Tokyo Museum: Actual size of building is displayed.

Sumida Hokusai Museum

Edo NOREN: restaurants of Japanese traditional dishes near

Ryogoku station of Japan Railways.

Sightseeing spots near the Sumida Ward

Asakusa: Sensouji temple and many small souvenior shops on the way to the temple, one of musts for foreigners, Famous sakura spot near Sumida river and Sakura cruising in Sumida river.

Sky Tree: a tower, newly developed sightseeing spot It's design is like Edo Kiriko Grass work.

### Sumida Hokusai Museum

Established in November in 2016

Specified to artworks of Hokusai(1760-1849), who is one of the popular Ukiyoe (picture, a color print) artists in Edo era. One of Hokusai's specialty is 36 pictures of Mt. Fuji from different angle. His pictures also show every day life of people including food and custom.


Accessibility of the museum: flat entrance, accessible toilet, wheel chair rental, but no braille information.

Free entrance fee for those who have certificate of persons with disabilities

Environment: \*Newly developed subway "Oedo line" is accessible, so new museums have been established near stations of "Oedo line".

## Sumida Hokusai Museum



### Edo Tokyo Museum

- Established in 1993 by Tokyo Metropolitan Government
- Introduces the history and culture of the Edo era

\*Edo era: 1603-1868, Tokugawa shogunate era

#### Accessibility:

Guide dogs are accepted.

Audio guide rental

Wheelchair, baby buggy rental

Toilet for wheelchair users, ostomates

Volunteer of foreign languages (English, Chinese, Korean, French, German, Spanish and Japanese)

Admission fee: free for persons with disabilities and up to two attendants, over 65 half of regular fee

### Ueno park area, Tokyo

Ueno: a cultural place with museums, a concert hall and a zoo. Ueno park is famous as sakura spots.

As the Ueno station used to be a terminal of railways, many songs were created with the feeling of pathos.

The followings are museums.

- Tokyo National Museum
- National Museum of Western Art
- National Museum of Nature and Science Etc.

### National Museum of Western Art

- This was established in 1959 for receiving Matsukata collection that was donated by French Government.
   Originally they were collected by Mr.Kojiro Matsukata who wished to establish a museum to display western artworks for young Japanese artists. Special exhibition is also planned.
- Main building was designed by Le Corbusier.
- Registered as a World Heritage which is one of the buildings designed by Le Corbusier in 2016
- Accessibility: flat entrance, elevator, multipurpose toilet
- Admmission fee of Matsukata collection (regular exhibition):
  People with disability, an attendant and over 65 :free

Books of Braille, tape and DAISY\* are available. It runs Sapie\*\*

\*DAISY= Digital Accessible Information System, International standard of digital book instead of tape book for people with visual impairment and print disability.

\*\*Sapie: Network of comprehensive information for persons with visual impairment on living and library and others. Sapie was developed by Japan Braille Library and run by the Society for Information Provision for Persons with Visual Impairment.

### **Tokyo Tama Library**

- The original library was established in 1913.
- It is run by Tokyo Metropolitan Government.
- Accessibility: multipurpose toilet including ostomates, mother child toilet Information for persons with visual impairment: braille information, recorded tape book, Daisy book, information on recent accessible book by newsletter and Sapience(Sapie)

Population of Musashino city: 144,000

Nick Name "Musashio Place" was decided in 2008.

Open in 2011

Concept: comprehensive, multipurpose functions, place for community people

It has **f**our functions. (Library, lifelong learning, Support of activities of children and youths, Support of activities of community people/NPOs) It is selected as one of 9 attractive libraries in Tokyo in internet.

Accessibility: flat entrance, barrier free toilet, reading service for persons with visual impairment
